## Rubbish!

Our most frequently asked question last year was about recycling: **What goes in which bin?**

### Mixed Recycling

- ✓ Plastic bottles and containers
- ✓ Paper and cardboard
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars

Communal recycling bins are either made from green plastic or cardboard and are located in corridors, meeting rooms and kitchens.

#### Other recyclables:

There are individual bins for used printer cartridges, batteries and envelopes in Reception in the main building.

### Landfill

- ✓ Food waste and coffee grounds
- ✓ Wood (e.g. coffee stirrers)
- ✓ Polystyrene
- ✓ Broken glass and crockery

Landfill bins are located in offices, meeting rooms and kitchens.

**Note:** Please ensure that broken glass and crockery is disposed of safely!
